Motorcycle Safety Basic Rider Course

Who should take this course?

Anyone planning to ride a motorcycle

Can I get my "M" endorsement on my license after completing the course?

Successful completion of this course ensures you an "M" endorsement on your driver's license. Driving and written motorcycle tests at the DMV will be waived.

Students under the age of 16 are required to take "Rules of the Road" test at the DMV.

Will this lower my motorcycle insurance?

All insurance companies maintain different policies regarding motorcycle insurance discounts. Some providers offer discount-incentives for completing a motorcycle rider safety course . Please contact your local insurance agent for further details.

Where will this course be given?

Southern Tech has a course designed in the parking lot of the Engineering Technology.

Instructors:

Instructors have successfully completed the MSF Basic RiderCourseSM RiderCoachSM Preparation Course. This consisted of classroom and range instruction, and fully complies with the instructional guidelines recommended by the Motorcycle Safety Foundation.

Can I bring my own scooter instead of using a motorcycle?

Students who may be approved to use their own scooter must provide:

- Proof of Liability Insurance at or above \$25,000 personal injury, \$50,000 injury per occurrence and \$10,000 property damage
- Proof of Ownership or permission to use
- Owner's registration
- Permission for the instructor to conduct a pre-ride safety inspection.

Classes will begin in April and will be offered at least the first and third weekends of each month during the riding season. Riding season is from March to November.

Minimum age is 14. IF LESS than 18, a parent or guardian must be present on the first day of class to sign a waiver. NO exceptions.
